

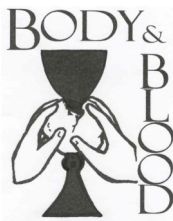

Do Not Remember, Re-Live

The Eucharist is the living memorandum of Jesus' passion, death and resurrection. But it is not just a "mental" recalling. It is a "sacramental" reliving. There is a big difference. To remember is to look back, to think over a past event, a mental response. Vibrant, spiritual remembrance means bringing an event out of the past and experiencing it anew today. This is the real blessing of the remembrance Jesus called us to. We do not celebrate Jesus' past presence, but Jesus' real Presence here today, in wine made blood, bread made flesh. It is with this understanding that we gather around the Lord's sacrificial table in response to Jesus' invitation "Do this in memory of Me."

Safe Environment Training Workshops

In accordance with the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, Sts. Peter and Paul Church will offer the Safe Environment Training workshop Thursday, June 9, at 6:30 p.m. in the Parish Hall. Any volunteer working with minors (such as CCD, VBS, CYO, or the Washington, D.C. Trip) needs to have this training. Sr. Mary Ellen Wheelahan, O. Carm., from the Archdiocese of New Orleans, will conduct the workshop. There is no need for pre-registration. Choose the date you can attend, show up and sign in with your name and the name of your parish/school when you arrive. The parish or school you designate will be responsible for conducting the background check. Safe Environment Training and background checks must be repeated every three years. Other workshops include: June 2—St. Anselm, Madisonville, 6:00-7:30 p.m.; August 4—Our Lady of the Lake, 10:00-11:30 a.m.
