I echo these words of our Holy Father, asking us to open our hearts as we connect on World Mission Sunday with every corner of the globe. . . with the Americas, where catechists travel to remote areas to bring the Good News of God’s great love to families; with Europe, where new churches are being built to welcome faith communities, renewed after years of persecution; with Asia, where six million children receive an education from Religious Sisters in some 16,000 Church-run elementary schools; with the Pacific Islands, where 3,000 young men are preparing for the priesthood, to bring the Lord’s healing hope and peace to those in need; with Africa, where those who are sick are provided with loving care at 6,400 Catholic hospitals and small clinics.

Grateful always for your generosity and prayers and confident of your missionary commitment to share the joy of the Gospel and help the poor, I pray for God’s blessings for you and all you hold in your heart.

But could there be a more challenging message for those who take stewardship seriously? Widows were the poorest and most vulnerable of people in Jesus’ time. 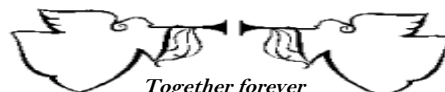
